Branch 19 Tours the Haight



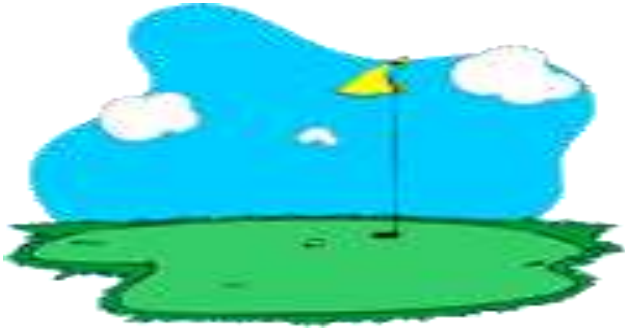

The focus was on the cultural impact and music coming out of San Francisco's Haight Ashbury community during that late 1960's era. The two hour walking tour included stops at the former residences of Janis Joplin, the Grateful Dead, the Jefferson Airplane, the Diggers community firehouse, and the Panhandle. Our SIR participants and their wives also JM92 had the opportunity to see and learn about the colorful history of the "painted ladies". These are some of the beautiful Victorian homes that have become an integral part of the neighborhood. 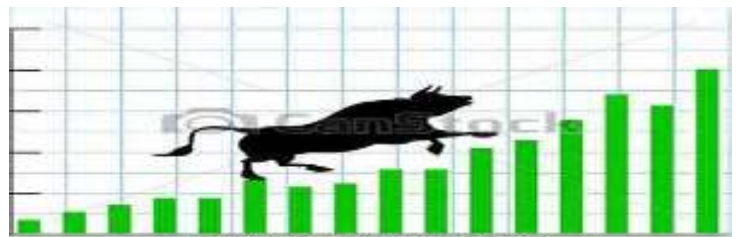
